## **Summary of Santa Cruz Community Health Status Subcommittee Meeting**

The Community Health Status Subcommittee met on April 20, 2016 to finalize their selection of recommended indicators for the MAPP Steering Committee. Eleven members of the subcommittee completed an online survey prior to the meeting to rank the 111 indicators under consideration. A detailed matrix allowed committee members to prioritize each measure based on several selection criteria. The top two choices within each of the 12 indicator categories were reviewed and discussed. The subcommittee reached consensus on the following 28 measures:
